The wine world lost a legend last year when Becky Wasserman-Hone, the iconic importer of Burgundian wine, passed away.

Wasserman had an outsized impact on the wine industry as a whole, and Burgundy in particular. Known for her caring, motherly touch, championship of lesser-known Burgundian domaines and unflinching integrity, Wasserman popularized the authentic tastes and terroir of Burgundy.

She was known for her selection and championing "the little guys," according to Allen Meadows, a longtime friend and founder of Burghound.com. "In baseball, there's a term called 'small ball,' and instead of going for the home run, you do a lot of singles," says Meadows. "She took little growers and enabled them to have a platform...It was a stroke of genius. Now everyone looks for small growers because no one was doing it before Becky." "She seemed to always give more than she got, and always tried to give a helping hand," says Meadows. "That's probably her enduring legacy in the greater wine world."

Daniel Johnnes, sommelier and founder of La Paulée de New York, a weeklong celebration of Burgundy's wines, calls Wasserman a "trailblazer as a young woman in the late 60s... in a field dominated by men."

One of the most enduring stories about Wasserman's early days is one of her distributors went bankrupt but Wasserman wanted to ensure that she made good on her obligation to pay her growers, so she mortgaged her house. That display of integrity cemented her reputation in the industry.

"She successfully earned the trust of many of the finest vignerons in France, not an easy thing to achieve for the best of us, and Becky earned it every day by running a business with honor," says Harmon Skurnik, president of Skurnik Wines & Spirits. "She has long set a good example for companies like ours, who came along later, demonstrating that one's name on the back label can stand for quality and integrity. There is no doubt that the wine world—and the world in general—are better places because of the long and successful life and career of Becky Wasserman."

Her work impacted generations of wine professionals, Johnnes says. "Later in life, Becky became a beacon and a mentor to scores of young people enthusiastic to learn about Burgundy." Wasserman's famously immersive, weeklong Burgundy deep dives, dubbed the "Bouilland Symposia," brought Burgundian vignerons, experts and aspiring vintners together to introduce and teach wine lovers the way of Burgundy through vineyard walks, cellar visits and convivial gatherings around the table.

"The connection between Becky Wasserman and Burgundy was, and is, not a one-sided relationship," says Ian Downey, executive vice president at Winebow Imports. "Both were profoundly changed by the introduction to the other... and the wine world is better for it. Her influence on Burgundy's ever-evolving story is not likely to be fully understood by any one person, but I'd imagine she'd be ok with that.

Magnum Château Lafite Rothschild 2006

estimated value: \$2,000

Let's continue the celebration of Château Lafite Rothschild with this top-notch magnum from a generous collector. This scored 97 points from Robert Parker, "One of the fabulous surprises, although I had suggested last year that it could jump in quality, of my tastings, the 2006 Lafite Rothschild is a great, great wine made from a blend of 82% Cabernet Sauvignon, 16% Merlot, and 2% Petit Verdot. When I tasted it from the barrel, it reminded me of their successful 1988, but it is dramatically superior to that vintage. Frankly, it may turn out to be as good as the 2005, which in all of Bordeaux is a far greater vintage than 2006. Lafite's severe selection process (42% made it into the grand vin) resulted in a full-bodied wine boasting an extraordinary perfume of charcoal, truffles, lead pencil shavings, and sensationally sweet, ripe black currant and cedar notes. A wine of extraordinary intensity, texture, and depth with silky tannins as well as awesome concentration, this has turned out to be a remarkable Lafite Rothschild that should be drinkable much earlier than the 2005, but age for three decades. Anticipated maturity: 2014-2035+."





This extraordinary, bold, courageous vision is now continued by the fourth generation of the family, represented by Prince Robert of Luxembourg, Chairman since 2008.

Located in the town of Pessac, just a few kilometres from Bordeaux, Château Haut-Brion – the first of the three estates acquired by the Dillon family – is the oldest winegrowing property in the region.

The 2001 received 97 points from Decanter, "It inches forward, rewarding patience with one of the most aromatically complex wines that you'll find in Bordeaux."

Magnum Harlan Estate 2005

estimated value: \$2,500

Robert Parker describes Harlan as not only one of the greatest wines of California, but of the world! This 2005 scored 98+ points, "extremely young, fresh, vigorous, yet still exuberant and promising 2005 Harlan Estate. Normally, the blends on these wines tend to be 85%-90% Cabernet Sauvignon and the rest tiny proportions of Cabernet Franc, Merlot and possibly some Petit Verdot, although I don't recall that being a very important part of the estate vineyard. The 2005 is incredibly youthful at age ten, although certainly drinkable. And who wouldn't consume it if they had the opportunity? It will benefit from another 5-10 years of cellaring and certainly has 30 or more years left in its evolutionary curve. Gorgeous, and tasting akin to a hypothetical Pauillac blended with a great Pessac-Léognan from Bordeaux comes to mind because of the smoky, subtle barbecue notes, fruitcake, forest floor, graphite and minerality. The wine has stunning fruit and a full-bodied, powerful richness, yet is still nimble on its feet. This is a classic Napa Cabernet Sauvignon from an absolutely magnificent hillside vineyard in the Mayacamas Mountains overlooking the Oakville corridor on the valley floor. This opaque, garnet/purple wine is another tour de force ..." - Robert Parker

Any serious wine project takes time. Just ask Harlan Estate and Bond founder Bill Harlan, whose third Napa Cabernet project, Promontory, took two decades to establish.

The 2013 received 99 points, the 2014 received 99 points and the 2015 received 98 points from Robert Parker's Wine Advocate.

"This 80-acre estate with 35 acres of vineyards high in the Mayacamas Mountains south of the Harlan Estate is another Cabernet Sauvignon project from Bill Harlan. It is hard to think of anything in Napa Valley as unexplored, pure wilderness, but Promontory Estate qualifies. I saw these wines last year, and now I've gotten the chance to see both the 2012 and 2013 again, and they are both even better than I had predicted when I tasted them last year. They are nearly all Cabernet Sauvignon with touches of Cabernet Franc, Malbec and Petit Verdot in them, and probably the best way to compare them to the wines of Harlan Estate or the Bond single-vineyard projects is to describe them as more like a Napa version of a great St-Estèphe such as Château Montrose thanks to their spicy, earthy characteristics, although I'm not suggesting there is any of the rusticity that one might expect from these mountain terroirs." - Robert Parker

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When you think Napa, you think of the Valley floor, but Napa's highest scoring wines and most exclusive waiting lists are actually far above the floor, in an area called Pritchard Hill. This area is so iconic because a combination of rocky red, volcanic soils, and the elevation, which gives it a unique combination of sunshine and cloud reflection.

Located on the east side of Napa Valley in the Vaca Mountain range, Pritchard Hill is one of the most picturesque wine regions in California. The vineyards offer stunning views — some overlook Lake Hennessy, while others feature breathtaking views of the valley floor vineyards. The hill was named after Charles Pritchard who settled and made wine there in the late 18th century.

Today, Pritchard Hill is a preeminent site for growing Bordeaux varietals, especially Cabernet, which accounts for 92% of the region's vines. And the wines that hail from the area are some of the best in the state.

Pritchard Hill's vineyards are located on volcanic rock at elevations ranging from 700 to 2,000 feet. And they have the enviable position of sitting above the fog line. The altitude protects them from spring frosts and allows the vines to experience the early morning sun. The lake and southern breezes moderate the temperature, so there is less fluctuation from day to night than on the valley floor. These warmer nights allow even ripening of the grapes. This unique topography also causes Pritchard Hill's grapes to ripen earlier than other mountain vineyards.

The Chappellet family trademarked the name Pritchard Hill in 1971. You won't see the name Pritchard Hill anywhere on the bottles, except for Chappellet's wine. The wines produced on Pritchard Hill use the Napa Valley Appellation. This makes finding wines from this area a bit tricky.

Pritchard Hill wines are worth the price and effort, though. Wine Spectator dubbed the area Napa's Grand Cru. The concentration and elegance, along with their expressive aromatics and long-aging potential also make them worth the search.

Most of the wineries on Pritchard Hill are family owned and some only produce small quantities of wine. There are less than 400 acres planted to vines. Due to the exclusivity and the quality of the wine, this is not an area to bargain shop.

The 2018 Cumulus received 100 points from Jeb Dunnuck, "the 2018 No 12 Cumulus Vineyard is as good as wine gets. Based on 47.7% Syrah, 23.4% Grenache, 21.3% Petite Sirah, 5.6% Mourvèdre, and the remaining 2% a mix of white varieties, aged 32 months in 34% new barrels, its vivid purple hue gives way to a full-bodied blockbuster of a wine that's loaded with cassis and blue fruits as well as notes of gravelly earth, graphite, ground pepper, and spring flowers. Flawlessly balanced, deep, super-rich, and unctuous, yet with incredible purity, give bottles a year of two and enjoy over the following 15 years or more."

And 99 points from Robert Parker's Wine Advocate, "This cuvée comes entirely from the Krankl's "home" vineyard—the Cumulus vineyard in Oak View, just south and inland from Santa Barbara, on the road to Ojai. There are now just over 12.5 acres planted at Cumulus. The first plantings of Syrah, Grenache and Roussanne took place in 2004. A little more Grenache was planted in 2005. Then in 2008, small blocks of Petite Manseng, Syrah, Touriga Nacional, Mourvedre and Petite Sirah were added, including 3.5 acres on its own roots."

The 2018 Touriga Nacional Numero Quatro received 98 points from Robert Parker's Wine Advocate, "it is a blend of 76% Touriga Nacional, 6.2% Petite Sirah, 9.1% Syrah, 7.2% Grenache and 1.5% Roussanne, using 35% whole clusters. It spent around 33 months in French oak barrels, 60% new. Featuring an opaque purple-black color, the nose opens like a rocket, soaring with plum preserves, blueberry pie, star anise and kirsch scents, followed by hints of tobacco leaf, cedar chest, dried lavender and menthol, plus a waft of dusty soil. The full-bodied palate is laden with black and red berry layers, supported by firm, grainy tannins and beautifully poised acidity, finishing with fantastic length and loads of red fruit and blossom sparks."
