#### 1 - Magnum Quilceda Creek Cabernet Sauvignon 2009

estimated value: \$425

"Make no mistake about the Quilceda Creek Cabernet Sauvignons - they are world-class Cabernets that compete with the finest wines from Bordeaux, Napa Valley, Sonoma, and Santa Cruz Mountains. This line up was one of the highlights of my trip through Washington and without a doubt, this awesome estate, which is run by Paul and Alex Golitzin, is producing some of the top Cabernet Sauvignon blends in the state, and I would venture, the world. While all of the wines are incredibly age-worthy, the tannins are so well managed and the textures so polished, they dish out immense pleasure even in their youth." - Robert Parker

97 points from the Wine Advocate, "Opening with soft aromas of crème brûlée, dusty dried blackberries and aged cocoa powder, the 2009 Cabernet Sauvignon lingers in the glass with a firm nose and alcoholic lift. Full-bodied, the palate is slightly shy and seems to be emerging from the change, as it shows the first signs of mature elements with slightly stewed black and red fruit with a rocky essence and mineral tension, not previously seen in any of the other Cabernets of the 20-year vertical."

Deep garnet-purple in color, it leaps from the glass with gregarious notions of baked plums, crème de cassis and blueberry pie plus hints of sandalwood, menthol, cinnamon stick and cedar chest with a waft of dried lavender. Medium to full-bodied, the palate is filled with juicy black and blue fruit layers, framed by a suggestion of soft tannins and plenty of freshness, finishing long and spicy. 343 cases were made."

This 12-year vertical case of the Time series wines from Native Flora includes sold out vintages from the personal cellar of the Flora's, and in fact, is the first time that a 12-year vertical has ever been assembled from their winery.

The Time series is a unique, multi-decade project designed to capture the relationship between climate, a single estate, and an identical wine made each year. They grow 9 different clones of Pinot Noir in their Dundee Hills vineyard. But they grow them over 7 distinct soil types, a 400' elevation change, N-S-E-W aspects, 5 rootstocks, and 3 micro-climates. It is a massively complicated vineyard.

The goal of this wine is to make the exact same vineyard-proportional blend of the entire estate. By blending all the soil types and clones, the high and low elevations, etc., they neutralize the impact that any one of those aspects might have on the finished wine. In essence, they erase all of the site and clone driven influences each year. The only factor which they cannot affect is the climate. By making the exact same wine each year, they create a living and educational anthology showcasing the amazing relationship and impact that climate has on Oregon's Willamette Valley pinot noirs.

Scott and Denise Flora would like to dedicate this collection to their recently and suddenly departed winemaker friend, Michael Martini, for whom this case was originally intended. Michael was the grandson of Louis M. Martini, founder of the wine dynasty in California. Michael was the head winemaker for Louis Martini Wines for over 40 years. Moreover, he was a fun-spreading, boisterous, enthusiastic lover of life. He was, and his wife, Jacque, remains a wine club member of Native Flora.

Last summer, Michael sent the Floras a 12-year vertical case of his personal wine project "M2". In return, Scott promised to send him a 12-year vertical from his personal cellar once

they had bottled the "2020 Time to Burn", completing the series. He passed away suddenly in January from cancer. The Floras thought it would be a nice way to honor their friend on an appropriate stage; he was a friend to virtually everyone he met. They adored him.

## 1 - Magnum Torii Mor La Cuillere Member's Reserve Pinot Noir 2018, signed

estimated value: \$110

The estate vineyard of Torii Mor was planted in 1972, making it one of the oldest vineyards in the Willamette Valley. Planted by Jim McDaniel, it was purchased in 1985 by Donald Olson. Located at 800 feet, high in the Dundee Hills, this site is benefited by warm southern exposure and cool evening breezes. Several clones of Pinot Noir are grown on-site as well as a small amount of Chardonnay and Pinot Gris. All vines are maintained by hand and pruned in the "double Guyot" (link: http://www.crushnet.com/enowiki/guyot) style, in which one cane from each side of the trunk head is trained onto a wire. This type of cane training is known as v.s.p (vertical shoot positioning). Olson Estate Vineyard is managed by Torii Mor's head winemaker, Jon Tomaselli. The quaint Japanese-themed property and tasting room is unique among Oregon wineries.

# 1 - Magnum Enfield Wine Co. Waterhorse Ridge Cabernet Sauvignon 2016

estimated value: \$140

Welcome to John Lockwood for his first Heart's Delight and hopefully you had a chance to taste his current release Waterhorse Ridge.

"Take everything you know of Cali Cab and throw it away. Then taste this graceful wine. From Sonoma County's tiny Fort Ross-Seaview AVA's Waterhorse Ridge Vineyard, and its loamy/ volcanic soils, this Cabernet-led blend is cooled by its elevation and proximity to the Pacific, 5 miles away. The 2 acre dry farm, organic, no-till vineyard is farmed and owned by grower Jesus Velasquez. Enfield Wine Co. is the family project of John Lockwood and Amy Seese, focused solely on producing low-intervention wines of individuality and place. John normally farms the sites himself, but this vineyard, nearly 20 years old, was so meticulously cared for by Jesus, he leaves it in capable hands. Sweet wild plum, wild cassis, perfumed raspberries flow along a slight palate, held with fine, long, bamboo tannins. The finish lingers with dusty gravels, alluring florals, and subtle spices. Acidity is bright, buoying this 14 degree wine far loftier than one would surmise. This shows cab sauv's grace and presence, and while drinking beautifully now, will be one to watch over the next few years." 93/100 - Wine Anorak

#### 1 - Magnum Williams Selyem Westside Road Neighbors Pinot Noir 2012

estimated value: \$170

"This wine is crafted from the finest growers along Westside Road – Allen, Bacigalupi, Bucher, Rochioli Riverblock and the Williams Selyem Estate. The brilliant, red color is simply captivating. Floral notes of red rose and crushed rocks permeate the nose. The glass fills with red fruit driven by notes of cranberry, fresh strawberries and raspberries. The nutmeg and allspice give way to a mineral-like finish, which is complemented by subtle vanilla flavors. This vintage is the first collaboration of winemaker, Chris Stamp, and his children Ben & Abby, who had just graduated with degrees in Enology. While tasting all the Riesling lots from 2012, the team decided they wanted to add this style Riesling to the winery's line-up. After lots of sampling and discussion, they decided on this combination of several lots, and to be sure all 3 generations were involved in the process. Bev Stamp (Chris's Mom) tasted and gave her blessing, and the first vintage of 3Generations Riesling was born. They bottled just 6 magnums to age and the rest was bottled and sold in 750ml bottles. This is one of the 5 remaining magnums of that first vintage.

#### 1 - Magnum Ramey Annum Cabernet Sauvignon 2016

estimated value: \$250

96 points from the Wine Advocate, "The 2016 Cabernet Sauvignon Annum, blended with 25% Cabernet Franc, offers pure aromas of red cherries, blackcurrants, dried thyme, cedar, tobacco leaves and rose petals. The full-bodied palate blossoms with layer after layer of nuanced fruit. It has a seamless structure, with lacy tannins, integrated yet persistent freshness and a tremendously long finish."

### 1 - Magnum Beaux Frères the Upper Terrace Pinot Noir 2010

estimated value: \$200

"Light and floral, offering a lovely rose petal grace note to the strawberry and cherry flavors, finishing with transparency and a gentle intensity." 92 points - Wine Spectator

The Beaux Frères story began in 1986 when Michael G. Etzel, then a wine salesman in Colorado Springs, embarked on a road trip to Oregon with his young family after reading an enticing review of an '83 Pinot Noir from the Willamette Valley. They took a whimsical detour and with an investment from Michael's sister Pat and her husband, wine critic Robert Parker Jr., the dream began to take shape. (The name Beaux Frères refers to the French idiom for "brother in law.") They moved to the farm the following summer, three little boys in tow, and Michael began his focused pursuit as a vineyard manager by planting only Pinot Noir and slowly transforming the farm into their jewel.

#### 6 - bottles Quintessa Rutherford 2004 in OWB

estimated value: \$1,100

In the northeastern corner of Rutherford, lies Quintessa. The estate is one of the most scenic properties of the Valley and one of extraordinary diversity. Agustin and Valeria Huneeus developed and maintain the property with a strict criteria of care for the soil and the environment.

"A dramatic young wine, fleshy and dazzling now for its lush fruit and oak, although the tannins have a crunchy hardness. But that merely ensures ageability. It's beautiful the way the acid-tannin structure plays against the cherry, cassis and olive fruit, creating an architectural tension. If you open this wine now, decant for a few hours. Otherwise, it should hold for six to eight years, and develop further bottle complexity afterward." – 95 points, Wine Enthusiast

### 1 - Magnum Rhys Vineyards Alpine Hillside Pinot Noir 2016 in OWB

estimated value: \$320

97+ points from Wine Advocate, "Rhys bottles the steepest, stoniest part of their Alpine Vineyard separately in years where the quality merits it and the quantity is sufficient to do so without depriving the regular Alpine bottling of its core, and when they do so, the results are invariably very special indeed. The 2016 Pinot Noir Alpine Hillside Vineyard is stunning, unfurling in the glass with a youthfully reticent but very deep bouquet of cherries, peonies and subtle forest floor. On the palate, the wine is full-bodied, tight-knit and concentrated, with immense depth and dimensions and structured around tangy acids and an ample—even rich—chassis of tannin. The finish is long and penetrating."

#### 2 - bottles Chateau Montelena Cabernet 2004

estimated value: \$250

95 points from Robert Parker, "A classic, old style Napa Cabernet Sauvignon, Montelena's 2004 reveals beautiful purity along with lots of creme de cassis fruit, a full-bodied mouthfeel, and a long finish. By Montelena standards, it is a bit more powerful than usual (14.1% alcohol). These wines have an uncanny ability to age for 2-3 decades, and while the 2004 is slightly more forward and evolved than other vintages have been (2001 and 2002), it should last for 20-25 years." Our kind donor did all of the hard work cellaring this for you and now it is ready to enjoy!
